

POLICY 22 - TRANSPORT

Introduction

The Glenelg Bowling Club recognises that it has a duty of care to members, spectators, guests and venue hire patrons whilst in the club grounds as well as when they are leaving the club in certain circumstances, such as illness, deemed intoxication or deemed drug use.

In such circumstances the designated club representative (e.g., Pennant Side Manager, on duty, RSA certified member, Home Umpire) will enquire about the safe journey to medical attention or home by means of:

- A friend at the club;
- A friend/relation who can come to the club;
- Calling a taxi free of charge and ensuring that the person has the means to pay for the fare.

In the case of a medical emergency, an ambulance will be called and arrangements will be made for a friend to inform a relative.

Our club no longer has a system of members advising of transport ahead of pennant matches. Where a member needs transport to play in away matches that member should advise team manager or selectors as soon as possible to arrange a suitable arrangement with other members.
